EMERGENCY MEETING OF THE
ARIZONA GAME AND FISH COMMISSION

Pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-431.02 (D), notice is hereby given that an emergency meeting of the Arizona Game and Fish Commission was held on July 19, 2004, at 12:00 p.m. by telephone conference call at the Arizona State Fairgrounds – Wildlife Building – McDowell & 17th Avenue, Phoenix, Arizona.

At the emergency meeting the Arizona Game and Fish Commission discussed and decided the following matter:

- 1. Presenter: Steve K. Ferrell, Deputy Director. Discussion of Options to Process Applications that are Affected by R12-4-114(E) to Comply with the July 13, 2004, U.S. District Court Order in the matter of *Montoya v. Manning*, CIV98-0239 PHX RCB.** The Commission discussed options to process applications that are affected by R12-4-114(E) to comply with the July 13, 2004, U.S. District Court Order in the matter of *Montoya v. In order to comply with the court's order in those hunts previously limited by R12-4-114(E), the Commission voted to issue a total of 127 additional deer tags and 678 additional elk tags to those individuals who were not drawn due to the provisions of R12-4-114(E). The Commission also voted to award tags to individuals selected in the first draw and to extend the permit-mailing deadline for tags from the original draw to July 30, 2004, and for the supplemental tags to August 30, 2004.
